

## Guidelines for visiting Sri Lakshmi Temple



- Please be aware that the temple, a place of worship is a place of healing and NOT a source of sickness. We request every devotee to keep it that way by following all published guidelines and do not visit the temple if you are sick, not feeling well or recently travelled to/from other countries/hotspots.
- Capacity of devotees at any point in time is limited to a certain number, regardless of auspicious day or not, as defined by the authorities. All devotees are limited to only one visit per day.
- The temple visit will be allowed only on appointments registered through the website www.srilakshmi.org and will be limited to a maximum of 45 minutes (30 minutes on weekdays) only for a family or individual and NO devotees will be allowed without prior appointment confirmation.
- Appointments can be done upto 2 day in advance. Please book only the appointments that you intend to keep. If you could not use your slot, please cancel it immediately to help other devotees. We request that this be done in the scheduling application itself and not call the temple for cancelling.
- All registration must include name, number of devotees in the group, a valid contact phone number, email and address
- Sponsors are requested to confirm their sponsorship 2 days in advance to help with planning and for assigning appointments in advance. Sponsors are requested to assemble in the designated areas (marked with a sign on the floor).
- Shoes/sandals must be left outside the temple separated in pairs and not close to pair of shoes of someone else. Members of one Family are requested to keep their shoes as one heap instead of spreading around thus saving space for other devotees.
- Devotees must register in advance and have confirmation email in their smart phone or printed copy at the entry point. The one-time only entry pass will have the number of devotees for the group and entire group is expected to enter the same time and exit on or before the scheduled exit time.
- Devotees must wear masks and socks at all the times within temple premises. Any violators will be asked to leave the premises immediately and any issues will need to be escalated to law enforcement as needed, per directions.
- All devotees must wash their hands at the entry point and must not touch walls or any objects within the temple premises.
- Floor markings for entry, exit and darshan will be strictly adhered to within the premises
- Any social conversations will be allowed with other devotees within the temple premises only if mandated social distance of 6 feet is maintained. Any violators may be asked to leave the temple premises immediately.
- All devotees registered for the hour will be allowed only after the scheduled devotees for the previous hour are left
- All children MUST stay at proximity with parents or chaperones.
- Please DO NOT PERFORM any prostration within the entire temple campus including next to Flag post.
- No Prasadam (prasadams, milk, fruits, flowers etc.) will be distributed to or accepted from devotees. Cafeteria will sell only pre-packaged food for to go only and NO dine-in within the cafeteria is allowed.
- PLEASE DO NOT ATTEMPT TO USE REST ROOMS WITHIN THE TEMPLE AND USE IT ONLY IN CASE OF EMERGENCY. Please plan for your visit accordingly and help maintain the hygiene and safety for staff and fellow devotees.
- Water fountains will not be operational based on public authority's guidance
- All devotees are expected to wear appropriate clothing so entire body is covered except for face/hands. Violators will be asked to leave the premises
- Temple accepts no liability with your visit
- Temple reserves the right to modify any of these guidelines. Devotees are requested to comply and cooperate with the staff and volunteers by following these guidelines
