

B. Balasubrahmaniyan, also known as Balu is a South Indian Karnatak music performer, educator and researcher. He began his music lessons from his father Sri. D. Balraj and subsequently studied under several teachers including Sangita Kala Acharya. Sri. B. Krishnamurthy, Sangita Kalanidhi.T. Brinda and Sangita Kalanidhi. T. Viswanathan. Balu received his PhD in music from the University of Madras. His Ph.D. dissertation focuses on "Reprints of Nandanar Caritram," a nineteenth

century Tamil opera by Gopalakrishna Bharati. He is a recipient of several awards and scholarships including Ford Foundation, Government of India and Maharajapuram Viswanatha Iyer Trust award for advanced training in Karnatak music. He has received several titles including "Tamil Isaip Paanar" (Musician of Tamil Music) title from Thanthai Periyar Tamil Isai Mandram, Chennai, "Yuva Kala Bharathi" (Youth Artist of India) award from Bharat Kalachar, Chennai, "Fetna (Federations of Tamil Association of North America) Annual Award" in 2008, Orlando, Florida, USA and "Kala Seva Mani" (Gem in service of the art) title from the Cleveland Tyagaraja Aradhana Festival. He set tunes for the 2nd century epic Cilappadikaram for its Bharata Natyam presentation by a well-known dancer and choreographer Narthaki Nataraj. Balu is an Adjunct Associate Professor of music at Wesleyan University, Middletown, CT where he has been teaching from 2003.
