Key Activities

- Building has been completed weather tight
- Waiting for Eversource to provide utility connection
- EFIS (Exterior Insulation Finishing System) work started this Spring and will be complete in another few weeks
- Stud work for the installation of dry wall is ready and waiting for power supply
- Elevator will be installed after obtain power supply

Power Supply Upgrade

- Power supply requirement has been designed to upgrade the existing system 600 amps to 3000 amps with new transformer vault

- This will satisfy the requirements for the future additions

Site Improvements

-Site improvements has to be provided as per Town of Planning Board decision

- -Items involved in the site improvments are,
 - * Re-routing storm water drianage
- * Revamp the existing detention basin and provide infiltrated system

* Grade changes as required with Islands -Ashphalt paving and layout of new parking -Received 3 quotes from vendors, final decision pending **Cost Details for this Expansion**

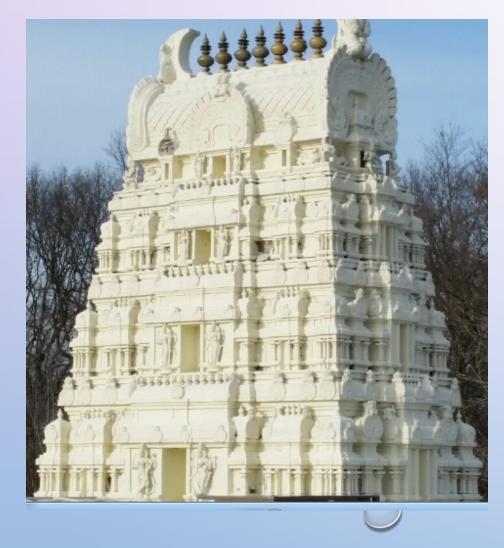

In the first 100 days of 2016, Front desk collections have crossed \$500,000 and we expect to cross \$1.5M for the FY 2016



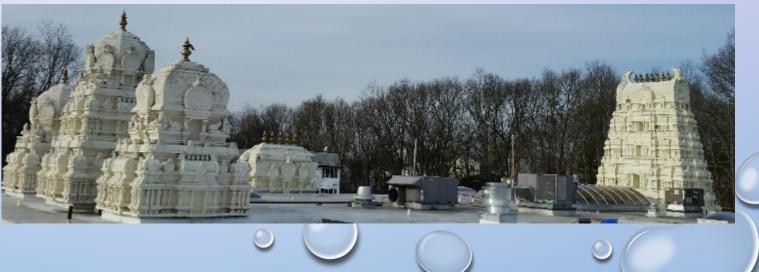
